PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 52 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SHELBY AND SUBMITTING SUCH PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORS.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Article XVIII, Section 7 of the Ohio Constitution, the City of Shelby adopted a Charter which became effective on January 1, 1922; and

WHEREAS, Section 123 of said Charter provides for the amendment thereof and the submission of proposed amendments to the electors of the City; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 52 establishing the Mayor's ability to form a Civil Service Commission; and

WHEREAS, The ability to make "lateral transfers" gives the City of Shelby greater flexibility in making original appointments to the positions of police officer and firefighter; and

WHEREAS, In order to make lateral transfers, it is necessary to amend the Charter of the City of Shelby; and

WHEREAS, It is in the interest of public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that an amendment to Charter Section 52 be submitted to the electorate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A TWO-THIRDS MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That there be submitted to the electors of the City at the election to be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2015, during the regular hours of voting at such date as prescribed by general law, the question of the amendment to Charter Section 52 as noted herein below with language to be deleted shown with strikethroughs and language to be added shown in capitals:

SECTION 52. (A) There may SHALL be a Civil Service Commission, with the powers and duties conferred or imposed by the law upon municipal civil service commissions, and the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council may SHALL form a Civil Service Commission. MEMBERS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION IN OFFICE AT THE TIME OF THE ADOPTION OF THIS SECTION SHALL CONTINUE IN OFFICE UNTIL THE EXPIRATION OF THEIR TERMS.

(B) IN THE CASE OF APPOINTMENT OF ANY PERSON TO THE ENTRY-LEVEL POSITION OF POLICE OFFICER, THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY MAY APPOINT PERSONS WHO HAVE OBTAINED AND MAINTAINED BASIC OHIO PEACE OFFICER CERTIFICATION (OR EQUIVALENT) AND WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY ANOTHER JURISDICTION AS A POLICE OFFICER, DEPUTY SHERIFF, OR STATE HIGHWAY PATROL OFFICER TO SUCH POSITION WITHOUT FIRST ADMINISTERING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION. IN THE CASE OF APPOINTMENT OF ANY PERSON TO THE ENTRY-LEVEL POSITION OF FIREFIGHTER, THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY MAY APPOINT PERSONS WHO HAVE OBTAINED AND MAINTAINED PROFESSIONAL FIREFIGHTER CERTIFICATION PARAMEDIC CERTIFICATION (OR EQUIVALENT) AND WHO ARE EMPLOYED BY ANOTHER JURISDICTION AS A FIREFIGHTER TO SUCH POSITION WITHOUT FIRST ADMINISTERING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION. IN LIEU OF A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION, THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY MAY ASSESS THE MERIT AND FITNESS OF ANY SUCH APPLICANT SO QUALIFIED BY REVIEW OF HIS OR HER RECORD WHILE EMPLOYED AS A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR FIREFIGHTER. THE SELECTION PROCEDURES AND SELECTION CRITERIA APPLICABLE TO SUCH PERSONS APPOINTED WITHOUT

TAKING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION SHALL BE AS SET FORTH BY A RULE DULY ADOPTED BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

Section 2: That the ballots on the proposed Charter amendment, as set forth in Section 1 hereof, for said election shall each be substantially in the following form or similar form as approved by the appropriate election authorities to express the intent and purpose hereof.

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT CITY OF SHELBY

A Majority Affirmative Vote is Necessary for Passage

The proposed amendment to Section 52 of the Shelby Charter requires that a Civil Service Commission be established and would permit an alternative method in the appointment of persons to the entry-level positions of police officer and firefighter.

Section 3: That the Richland County Board of Elections and the Mayor, Clerk of Council, and Director of Law of the City of Shelby are hereby directed and authorized to take all action necessary to submit the above question to the electors of the City at the election held on November 3, 2015.

Section 4: That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance to the Richland County Board of Election no later than 4:00 p.m. on the sixtieth day prior to the date of the election.

Section 5: That the Director of Finance and Public Record shall provide notice of this proposed amendment to the Charter in a newspaper of general circulation not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the election.

Section 6: That said amendment, if approved by the electors, shall become effective January 1, 2016.

Section 7: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

Section 8: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 24 -2015 (Sponsors—Councilmembers Carlisle and Martin

AMENDING SECTION 236.04 (CONTRACTS, MATERIALS AND LABOR) OF CHAPTER 236 (DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SHELBY.

WHEREAS, situations have occurred recently that slowed the process for purchases or contracts for materials and/or labor at costs over \$25,000 but under \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that Section 236.04 of said chapter be amended to allow for situations that were not considered at the time of amendment in 2005.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That Section 235.04 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Shelby be amended to read as follows:

236.04 CONTRACTS, MATERIALS, AND LABOR

The Mayor, as ex officio Director of Public Safety, may make all contracts and expenditures of money under \$25,000 for acquiring lands for the erection or repairing of station houses, police stations, fire department buildings, fire cisterns and plugs, that are required for the purchase of engines, apparatus and all other supplies necessary for the police and fire departments, and for other undertakings and departments under the Director's supervision. No obligation involving an expenditure of more than \$25,000 but less than \$50,000 shall be created unless first authorized and directed by ordinance or resolution of the city legislative authority. In making, altering or modifying contracts over \$50,000, the Director shall be governed by R.C. Sections 735.05 to 735.09, except that all bids shall be filed with and opened by the Director of Public Safety. The Director shall make no sale or disposition of any property belonging to the city without first being authorized by resolution or ordinance of the city legislative authority.

Section 2: That all other sections of Chapter 236 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.

AMENDING SECTION 242.01 (CONTRACTS, MATERIALS AND LABOR) OF CHAPTER 242 (DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SHELBY.

WHEREAS, situations have occurred recently that slowed the process for purchases or contracts for materials and/or labor at costs over \$25,000 but under \$50,000; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that Section 242.01 of said chapter be amended to allow for situations that were not considered at the time of amendment in 2005.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That Section 242.01 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Shelby be amended to read as follows:

242.01 CONTRACTS, MATERIALS, AND LABOR

The Mayor, as ex officio Director of Public Service may make any contract, purchase supplies or materials, or provide labor for any work under the supervision of the Department of Public Service involving not more than \$25,000. When an expenditure within the department, other than the compensation of persons employed therein, exceeds \$25,000 but less than \$50,000, such expenditures shall first be authorized and directed by ordinance or resolution of city council. When an expenditure within the department, other than compensation of persons employed therein, exceeds \$50,000, such expenditures shall first be authorized and directed by ordinance or resolution. When so authorized and directed, except where the contract is for equipment, services, materials or supplies to be purchased under R.C. section 713.23(D) of R.C. section 125.04 or section 5513.01 or available from a qualified nonprofit agency pursuant to R.C. sections 4115.31 to 4115.35, the Director shall make a written contract with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement for not less than two or more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the city.

Section 2: That all other sections of Chapter 242 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

Section 4: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.

VACATING AN ALLEY RUNNING PERPINDICULAR FROM SECOND STREET BETWEEN LOTS 520 AND 521 IN THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO.

WHEREAS, on the 1st day of June, 2015, the council of the City of Shelby adopted Resolution No. 23-2015 and in so doing declared its intent to vacate an alley running perpendicular of Second Street within the City of Shelby, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, notice of adoption of the above Resolution has been provided to the owners of property abutting said alley thereby notifying said property owners of the time and place at which objections could be presented to the Board of Revision of Assessments (pursuant to Section 105 of the charter of the City of Shelby); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Revision of Assessments met on June 16, 2005; (said meeting procedure being in accordance with provisions of Section 105 of the charter of the City of Shelby) and voted to approve and recommend the vacation of an alley running perpendicular of Second Street between lots 520 and 521 within the City of Shelby, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the council of the City of Shelby is satisfied that there is good cause for vacating said alley which is hereinafter described and that said vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest and public welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That an alley running perpendicular of Second Street within the City of Shelby, Ohio and as set forth in the legal description as prepared by F.E. Krocka & Associates, Inc.-Raymond G. Lenczowski, registered surveyor, on January 18, 2013 and designated as the plat of vacation of a 16-foot alley adjacent to Lots 520 & 521, Richland County Recorder Plat Volume 2#3, Page 15 of the records of the City of Shelby, Richland County, Ohio is hereby vacated.

Section 2: That in accordance with Section 105 of the charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio, the city shall retain any and all easements necessary for the maintenance of utilities currently located within said alley

ORDINANCE NO. 21-2015 (Sponsors: Councilmembers McLaughlin and Martin)

ACCEPTING AND CONFIRMING FOR DEDICATION TO THE PUBLIC USE THE UTILITIES, STREETS AND/OR ROADWAYS OF BLACK FORK COMMONS AND DELCARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The Shelby Board of Park Commissioners has completed a project that created new roadways and alteration of utilities; and

WHEREAS, on October 29, 2014, the Planning Commission of the City of Shelby approved the plat as submitted to said body; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that said dedication be confirmed by the Council of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A 2/3 MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the Plat of Black Fork Commons as described in the attached "Exhibit A" is hereby confirmed.

Section 2: That the premises set forth on said plat as utilities, streets and/or roadways are dedicated by the owners as public utilities and hereby accepted and confirmed as such.

Section 3: That the Mayor of the City of Shelby is hereby authorized to sign on said plat as the owner satisfying the premises set forth on said plat as a right-of-way/street is dedicated by and hereby accepted and confirmed as such.

Section 4: That the plat and a record of the passage of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Auditor and Recorder of Richland County for inclusion in the official records of said county.

Section 5: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.
