ORDINANCE NO. 23 -2023
(Sponsors – Councilmembers Gates & Martin)

REPEALING CHAPTER 880 (EARNED INCOME TAX REGULATIONS EFFECTIVE THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2015) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SHELBY.

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance and Public Record confirms that the City of Shelby no long collects city income tax under the provisions of Chapter 880 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Shelby; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that said chapter be repealed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That Chapter 880 (Earned Income Tax Regulations Effective Through December 31, 2015) of the Codified Ordinance of the City of Shelby shall be and is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.



ORDINANCE NO. 24-2023
(Sponsor – Councilmember Gates)

ENACTING SECTION 204.06 (OFFICIAL TREE) OF CHAPTER 204 (OFFICIAL STANDARDS) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SHELBY.

WHEREAS, in 1807 when government surveyors laid out the territory upon which Shelby would later be established into townships and sections, they referenced section corners and quarter-section corners to existing trees of the old-growth forest; and

WHEREAS, the species most often used for reference in Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 of Township 22, Range 19 was the sugar maple tree; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that the sugar maple be designated as the City's official tree.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That Section 204.06 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Shelby be enacted to read as follows:

204.06 OFFICIAL TREE.

The tree *Acer saccharum*, commonly known as the sugar maple, is hereby adopted as the official tree of the City in recognition of it being the source of maple syrup and for its brightly colored fall foliage.

Section 2: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby.

RESOLUTION NO. 41 -2023
(Sponsor- Councilmember Gates)

RECOGNIZING AND HONORING SHELBY'S FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH ON THE OCCASION OF ITS BICENTENNIAL.

WHEREAS, in 1823, a small number of Sharon Township residents sent a request to the Presbytery of Richland County to be recognized as a congregation; and

WHEREAS, those sturdy pioneers met in each other's homes to hold services, sometimes at Mr. Smith's house at Taylor's Corners, now known as Taylortown, and other homes south and west of the small village of Shelby; and

WHEREAS, over the past two hundred years, that small congregation has grown and prospered and will honor its two hundred years of Christian ministry on Sunday, September 17, 2023, with worship and a special celebration; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that the First Presbyterian Church be recognized and honored on the occasion of its bicentennial.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the First Presbyterian Church – affectionately known as the Red Stone Church – be recognized and honored on the occasion of the bicentennial of its founding.

Section 2: That the Council extend its best wishes to Pastor James Robinson, to the deacons and elders, and to the members and friends of said church whose influence and outreach have benefited the greater Shelby community throughout the years.

Section 3: That the Clerk of Council present First Presbyterian Church an authenticated copy of this Resolution.

Section 4: That the Clerk of Council cause this Resolution to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation published within the city limits.

Section 5: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Resolution have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

Section 6: That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.


