ORDINANCE NO. 20 -2024
(Sponsor: Councilmember McLaughlin)

ACCEPTING AND CONFIRMING FOR DEDICATION TO THE PUBLIC USE THE UTILITIES, STREETS AND/OR ROADWAYS OF THE LAMB SUBDIVISION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Lamb Subdivision has completed a project that created new roadways and alteration of utilities; and

WHEREAS, on August 27, 2024, the Planning Commission of the City of Shelby approved the plat as submitted to said body; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Shelby that said dedication be confirmed by the Council of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A TWO-THIRDS (2/3) MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That the Plat of Lamb Subdivision as described in the attached "Exhibit A" is hereby confirmed.

Section 2: That the premises set forth on said plat as utilities, streets, and/or roadways are dedicated by the owners as public utilities and hereby accepted and confirmed as such.

Section 3: That the Mayor of the City of Shelby is hereby authorized to sign on said plat as the owner satisfying the premises set forth on said plat as a right-of-way street is dedicated by and hereby accepted and confirmed as such.

Section 4: That the plat and record of the passage of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Auditor and Recorder of Richland County for inclusion in the official records of said county.

Section 5: That all meetings and hearings concerning the adoption of this Ordinance have been in compliance with Codified Ordinance 220.01, Ohio Revised Code Section 121.22, and the Charter of the City of Shelby, Ohio.

Section 6: That this Ordinance is hereby deemed to be an emergency for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health or safety, and therefore, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the Mayor, and the earliest period allowed by law.

POSTHUMOUSLY RECOGNIZING THE LIFE AND LEGACY OF WORLD WAR II VETERAN AND FORMER SHELBY CITY COUNCILMAN, DALE E. BRICKER.

WHEREAS, over 16 million Americans served their country and its Allies during the course of World War II; and

WHEREAS, the generation of men and women who served the United States in World War II has been called "the greatest generation" for their selfless sacrifice; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Dale Bricker was a World War II Veteran of the 410th Quartermasters Depot Company, serving from 1943 to 1946 in the American & Asiatic Pacific Theater of Operations; and

WHEREAS, after his military service, Dale worked at the Wilkens Air Force Depot in Shelby from 1952 to 1958; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Bricker also was involved many years in public service as Mansfield City Council Clerk of Council, and Richland County Director of Elections. He also served in the Secretary of State's office. Dale also served as the Mohican State Park Manager from 1979 to 1982. Mr. Bricker also served on the Shelby City Council in 1996 to 1997. He was also the proud owner and director of Shelby's local art and craft museum, known to locals as The Gallery.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO A MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: That Shelby City Council hereby recognizes and honors the memory Mr. Dale E. Bricker for his bravery and sacrifice while serving our great country during World War II.


