Objective

The Shelby City Council, in conjunction with the Shelby Community Improvement Corporation, is seeking proposals for the sale and redevelopment of the historic 1872 Fire Station.

Scope of Proposal

All proposals must include the following components:

- Statement of the proposed use of the building
- Exterior preservation and improvements plan
- Interior alterations and improvements plan
- Detailed financial plan including proposed capital investment and long-term sustainability
- Timeline for project start and completion

Expected Timeframe

• Proposal Due: September 2, 2025

• Shelby City Council Review: September 15, 2025

• Potential Award Date: October 6, 2025

Proposal Format and Requirements

Proposals must include the following sections:

- Letter of Interest: Statement of intended end use of the building
- Personnel: Ownership structure and key individuals or organizations
- Experience: Relevant experience with rehabilitation and historic preservation
- Approach to Project: Key tasks, responsibilities, and support needed
- Financial: Sources of funds and sustainability plan

Submission Instructions

Submit a Statement of Qualification (SOQ) proposal, maximum 20 single-sided pages (8.5 x 11, 12-point font).

Proposals must be submitted by 4:00 PM on September 2, 2025, clearly marked 'City of Shelby 1872 Fire Station'. Late submissions will not be accepted.

Evaluation Process

Proposals will be evaluated based on:

- Quality and completeness of the proposal
- Financial qualifications and feasibility
- Proposed use and benefit to the Shelby community
- Relevant experience and project approach
- Historic preservation and architectural sensitivity

A scoring rubric may be used to ensure transparency and consistency in evaluation.

Terms and Conditions

- The City reserves the right to reject any or all proposals.
- The City may request clarification or additional information.
- The City is not responsible for costs incurred in proposal preparation.
- All submissions become public documents subject to disclosure.

- Terms of sale shall include a detailed development agreement with a claw back reversionary clause and first right of refusal of future sale.
- The City of Shelby shall maintain an ingress/egress and utility easement (surveyed by FE Krocka and Associates Inc., Nathan W Sautter, Ohio registered surveyor #8252 on March 18, 2025)
- A quit-claim deed shall be used to transfer said real property.
- Said real property to be sold "as is where is" with no warranties whatsoever, either express or implied.
- The City may modify or terminate the RFP process at any time.

Historic Note: The 1872 Fire Station is a landmark of Shelby's civic heritage. Proposals that honor its architectural and historical significance are encouraged.
