DIRECTING THE RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD OF ELECTIONS TO CONDUCT AN ELECTION TO DETERMINE WHETHER 0.9 MILL SHALL BE LEVIED ON THE TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY OF SHELBY FOR THE GENERAL OPERATION OF THE SHELBY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 21-2026 (passed June 15, 2026) the Shelby City Council determined and declared that the amount of taxes to be raised at the maximum rate allowed by law without a vote of the electors would be insufficient for the general operation of the Shelby Department of Health; and

WHEREAS, by said same Resolution the Shelby City Council determined that a rate of 0.9 mill on each dollar of valuation of the taxable property within the City should be raised in order to operate the Shelby Department of Health.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHELBY, OHIO, A TWO-THIRDS (2/3) MAJORITY ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1: The Richland County Board of Elections is hereby directed to place upon the general election ballot of November 3, 2026 the question of whether 0.9 mill on each dollar of taxable value of taxable property within the City of Shelby, Ohio shall be levied and raised for the general operation of the Shelby Department of Health.

Section 2: That the ballot shall be substantially in the following form:

PROPOSED REAL ESTATE TAX (RENEWAL)

CITY OF SHELBY

A Majority Affirmative Vote is Necessary for Passage.

A renewal of a tax for the benefit of the City of Shelby for the purpose of GENERAL OPERATION OF THE SHELBY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH at a rate not exceeding 0.9 mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$0.09 for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for 5 years, commencing in 2027.
